

Tell the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality that Michigan does NOT need more dirty coal plants!

Even though studies show energy demand in Michigan is declining, Consumers Energy and Wolverine Power Supply Cooperative want to build new dirty coal plants in our Great Lakes State. The Governor issued an Executive Directive that said before investing in polluting coal power plants, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) must decide if there is a need for new electric power and, if so, whether there are better alternatives than dirty coal plants.

By signing this petition, you are telling the MDEQ to deny the Consumers Energy and Wolverine coal plants because:

- These companies have not provided complete information on the actual need for power and the true cost of renewable energy;
- There is no need for new coal power in the state; and
- Cleaner alternatives like energy efficiency, wind or solar power are better choices to meet electric demand.
