Senate Scorecard Votes

- 1) Bill SF834, a resolution asking Congress to reject the Central American Free Trade Agreement (CAFTA). Author: Stumpf. May 13, 2005. Passed 46-10. Environmental Vote: For.
- 2) Bill SF1298, to create a manufacturer-responsibility program for recycling electronic waste. Author: Higgins. May 19, 2005. Passed 44-22. Environmental Vote: For.
- 3) Amendment to the 2005 Data Practices Bill, HF225, to make pesticide applicator data public information. Author: Lourey. May 20, 2005. Failed 33-33. Environmental Vote: For.
- 4) The Clean Water Legacy Act, SF762, to fund the testing, clean up, and pollution prevention of Minnesota's lakes, rivers and streams, as required by the federal Clean Water Act of 1972. Author: Fredrickson. May 23, 2005. Passed 65-0. Environmental Vote: For.
- 5) Amendment to the Eminent Domain Bill, SF2750, to eliminate a harmful proposal that would force local governments to pay compensation for requiring a property to come into compliance with new zoning requirements. Author: Kelly. March 27, 2006. Failed 25-41. Environmental Vote: For.
- 6) The straight-pipe septic system compliance bill, SF2437; requiring that illegal septic systems that drain sewage directly to ditches and water bodies come into compliance within ten months of discovery, or be fined \$500 for each month thereafter. Author: Jungbauer. April 27, 2006. Passed 63-0. Environmental Vote: For.
- 7) The Mercury Reduction Bill, HF3712, to require Minnesota's three largest coal-fired power plants to reduce mercury emissions 90% by 2015. Author: Dibble. May 4, 2006. Passed 66-0. Environmental Vote: For.
- 8) Amendment to the Supplemental Budget Bill, HF4162, to eliminate funding and requirements for emergency response to the release of an expanded list of "extraordinarily hazardous substances." Author: Senjem. May 8, 2006. Passed 34-33. Environmental Vote: Against.
- 9) Amendment to the 2006 Energy Policy Bill, to SF2798, that would have dramatically reduced the scale of a proposed Renewable Electricity Standard. Author: Senjem. May 11, 2006. Failed 41-24. Environmental Vote: Against.
- 10) Amendment to the 2006 Energy Policy Bill, SF2798, to create a 20% Renewable Electricity Standard by 2020. Author: Anderson. May 11, 2006. Passed 36-30. Environmental Vote: For.
