Dear County Council Members:

The Anne Arundel Alliance for Livable Communities urges you to vote in favor of Resolution 18-17, which asks the County Executive to begin the comprehensive review of the 2009 General Development Plan (GDP) during 2017 and to incorporate citizen participation into the review process. Additionally, we recommend that the Resolution call for adequate funding for consulting and other resources to support the GDP update in the FY18 and FY19 budgets.

Preparation of the General Development Plan is required and is one of the most important efforts undertaken by county government. What will our county be in the next decade? What kind of future best serves county residents? What kind of growth is sustainable? How do we get there? These are all questions to be asked and answered in preparing a General Development Plan. A review of the current GDP, that includes meaningful public participation from the beginning, is the first step in developing a new plan for the County's future.

This GDP update provides an opportunity to set a clear vision for the county that addresses the public outcry for improved transportation and other infrastructure, protection of our environment, and greater economic competitiveness. Prince George's County's Comprehensive Plan was recently recognized as one of the Top 5 in the nation for sustainability. Our new GDP should also chart a sustainable course that safeguards and enhances residents' quality of life.

Many changes in land use and zoning have occurred since 2009. There are a host of alternatives and priorities that will decide the County's future. Certain proposals for land use in the County need the kind of comprehensive review that is part of the GDP process. Of course, in order to begin a robust review process
